HAMAN'S PLOT TO DESTROY THE JEWS

10 Then the royal officials at the king's gate asked Mordecai, "Why do you disobey the king's command?"

When Haman saw that Mordechai would not kneel down or pay him honor, he was enraged. He thought, "If Mordechai is Jewish, he is a Jew who has scorned the idea of killing only Mordechai. Instead, he will try to destroy all Mordechai's people, the Jews, throughout the whole kingdom of Persia." Haman then said to the king, "I have discovered that there is a Jew here (that is, the presence of Haman to select a day and month. And the lot fell on" the twelfth month, "Then Haman said to King Xerxes, 'There is a certain people dispersed among the peoples of your kingdom who keep themselves separate. Their customs are different from the people, and they do not obey the king's laws; it is not in the king's best interest to tolerate the king, let a decree be issued to destroy them, and I will give ten thousand talents' of silver."

...the king took his signet ring from his finger and gave it to Haman son of Hammedatha the king's treasurer. "The king said to Haman," and so with the people. Then on the thirteenth day of the first month the royal secretaries were summoned. To scribe of each province and in the language of each people all Haman's orders to the king, errors of the various provinces and the nobles of the various peoples. These were written to Xerxes himself and sealed with his own ring. "Dispatches were sent by couriers to all with the order to destroy, kill and annihilate all the Jews — young and old, women and men, on the thirteenth day of the twelfth month, the month of Adar, and to plunder their property. The text of the edict was to be issued as law in every province and made known to the people so they would be ready for that day.
